# Pastor's Message



October 23, 2017

Dear members and friends of St. John's,

I have been asked by Church Council to write to you asking for your help in reducing a major deficit in our operating fund by year-end. Significantly reducing this debt will require extra effort from our whole congregation from now until December 31.

As you are able, please consider either an increase

in your regular offerings or a special gift to St. John's before Dec. 31, 2017 directed/marked to our deficit fund.

Our congregation is richly blessed by everyone's participation. We are blessed to be in shared ministry with St. James Evangelical Lutheran Church in Renfrew. We are healthy and alive and very giving and generous! Our *average* worship attendance is 38. We have a small Sunday School. Our outreach efforts have been very much appreciated. In our Mission for Others we support the Arnprior Food Bank, the Grove Post Card Campaign, Hospice Renfrew, the Big Give, Christmas Baskets, Canadian Food Grains Bank, Canadian Lutheran World Relief, and Lutherlyn Camp and Conference Centre. We are involved in our local community and the global world around us!

Whenever there has been an "in house" need we fill it! For example, our recent September roofing expenses have been covered by gracious contributors of time, talent, resources and finances.

At our October Church Council meeting, our treasurer reported a deficit of - \$24,000. Our Synod Benevolence is behind by \$900.

Church Council has made some immediate recommendations:

- Communicate our financial need to the congregation. (this letter and information sharing at worship on Nov. 12<sup>th</sup>)
- No shared services with St. James for the rest of 2017
- Eliminate unnecessary spending- sticking to essential expenses
- Design a major fundraiser for St. John's

Our faith community is solely funded by what comes in on the offering plate. When you designate where your money is to go - it goes there. When we receive grant money from the Eastern Synod, it is forwarded to the organization that we have requested to assist (i.e. the Arnprior Food Bank). When you are away from our church, we hope that when you return that you are able to make up those missed Sunday contributions to St. John's.

**Together we can do this! Every contribution helps!** It is time now to make our internal responsibilities a priority. We all want to give in ways that are pleasing to God, life-giving to others, and consistent with our sense of personal integrity. How each one of us responds is connected to our own personal financial situation. It is also a question of where in our hearts we place the needs of our faith community. Church council knows that many members are on a fixed income. We hope that there are those who are able

to respond to this appeal, adding to the financial support they already provide. **Together** we can strengthen our various ministries and mission!

My prayer is that St. John's Evangelical Lutheran Church – you the people – may continue to grow in the grace we have already received in such abundance. Please consider this request prayerfully. Thank you!

# **October Church Council Report**

# Pastor's Report:

 Pastor provided an update on the various worship services and meetings she attended during the previous month, as well as numerous pastoral care events. Planned events, such as the Commemoration of the Reformation and Eastern Synod, were also discussed.

# **Finance Report**

- Despite lower than anticipated attendance, we continue to achieve relatively significant costsavings related to expenses.
- Balance sheet shows \$45,611 in cash. Given our deficit, we will deplete this in less than 2 years if nothing changes. As a result, we now need to determine if there are ways we can defer or offset existing expenses or increase contributions from the congregation or through some other means (e.g., a fund-raiser).

# **Other Reports**

## **Property**

- We will need to purchase a new hose and sweeper for the vacuum, which will probably cost around \$500.
- Members of the congregation have been volunteering to help with church cleaning while our
  custodial staff recovers from an injury. Those members of the congregation who can volunteer
  on a regular basis (i.e., a couple of hours each week) are encouraged to talk to a council
  member.
- The floor in the basement downstairs is in disrepair and at least a portion of it will need to be ripped up and then a decision will be made what to do (replace the flooring or leave as concrete). Will discuss and decide at next Council meeting.

### Other Business

- We will continue to use recorded music, thanks to a professional pianist, for many of Sunday Services the quality and tempo are excellent.
- St. John's has registered to enter a float in the Arnprior Santa Claus parade on November 25, as well as the Almonte Santa Claus parade on December 3 and anyone with ideas for the float, or who wishes to participate in the construction of the float or be on the float should contact a member of Council.
- Spaghetti supper in support of Hospice Renfrew is planned for Oct. 26<sup>th</sup> The congregation is asked to bring desserts.


