## *Pastor's Message*

### **A Perspective for Lent**

During the end of February you may see ads for Shrove Tuesday suppers and Ash Wednesday Services and wonder what all the fuss is about. Lent is a traditional liturgical season in the Christian calendar that many still take seriously as a time of preparation - 40 days to be exact – for Easter. As we count down this time it is also to welcome signs of spring and that maybe a more enticing thought for you.

Traditionally the days before Ash Wednesday took on a festive air as Lenten diets were to be devoid of fats and oils. It became necessary in western civilizations to use up the oil in the house before Lent began. Hence Pancake Tuesdays ! In Germany it is called Fastnacht; in France Mardi Gras; in Latin countries Carnivale and in England Pancake Tuesday. After all the feasting then many people give things up – like chocolate or desserts or shopping or smoking for the 40 days.

Other people add to their weekly list – doing a kind deed for someone else every day, or paying it forward in some way for others, or volunteer at a charity or write a cheque to help out an agency. Lent calls us to deepen our faith and our spirituality. It calls for daily prayer, meditation or fasting.

However you decide to spend your next 40 days keep your God and your neighbor in mind. May you have a blessed and holy Lenten journey.

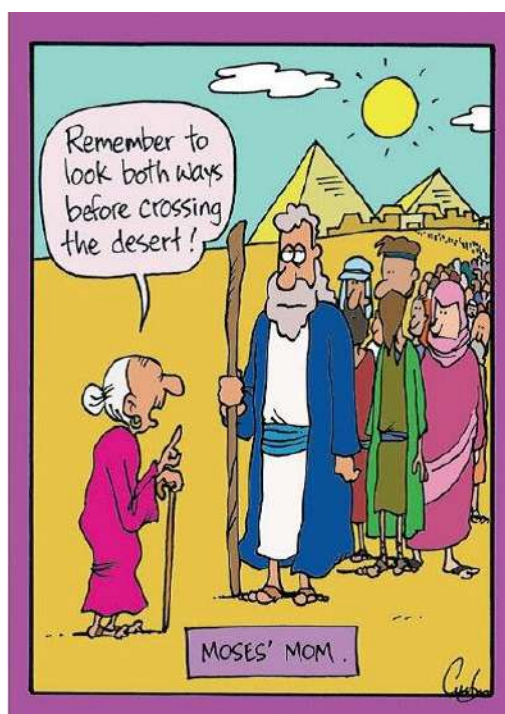

February 18, 2020

Meeting was called to order at 7:30 pm and Pastor opened with devotions and a prayer.

### Previous Minutes:

Dave moved the minutes be approved as published, Randy seconded. **CARRIED**

### Pastor's report:

- Pastor presented her activity report for the month.
- Pastor thanked Randy for preparing the Annual Report.
- Pastor handed out a notice of a Grant Preparation Workshop on May 2<sup>nd</sup> in Ottawa.
- Council to be installed March 1<sup>st</sup>.

### Inter-congregational co-operation:

Randy collected the schedules from other churches, which will be posted. We need to keep their events in mind when we schedule our events.

### Finance:

- P&L presented, monthly budget not in the system yet.
- Expenses are in line.
- Attendance is still quite light.
- Balance Sheet- Discussion on reserves and investments.

### Outreach:

Joint Ministry: Easter schedule was set with St. James holding Maundy Thursday Joint service at 7:00 p.m. and St. John's holding the Good Friday service.

### Property:

- In retrospect, council should have had more thorough discussions regarding options for the basement floor before presenting to the congregation.
- Randy has a quote for re-trenching around the entire church and new drainage: \$16,900.
- An option is that we can do the retrenching work ourselves with a member's backhoe and volunteer labour.

### Town construction project:

- Reconstruction of Alicia Street from McLachlin to Division Street will begin as early as June 1 and will be completed by mid-August. Sidewalk from McLachlin to our back walkway is to be replaced. Randy to follow up to ensure we're kept in the loop on this project.
- This work will prevent challenges for VBS, BBQ and Yard Sale. Yard sale date should be moved to late May.

### Marketing:



Enid wanted to understand what events we should market to the community. It was agreed that Easter breakfast and Camp Sunday would be advertised to the wider community. Also, VBS, the Spaghetti supper & the Bazaar will be widely marketed.

### Other Business:

- Ryan to purchase Sunday School and VBS packages.
- Next council meeting will be on March 23<sup>rd</sup> (one week later)
- Jeff to let Pastor know about the presentation to the food bank.
- Privacy issue re birthdays in the newsletter – we need to update the privacy permission forms. Jeff to send existing forms to Dave.
